The Supervisor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

THE MINUTES OF THE JUNE 13, 2024, TOWN BOARD MEETING were approved as typed on a motion by Councilman Peters, 2nd by Councilman Walker, with 4 in favor, Councilman Goettsche absent.

1.DELAWARE ENGINEERING: Delaware Engineering John Brust was not present. Supervisor Hoyt stated John Brust is working with Camp Oh-Neh-Tah (Girls Camp), High Peak Road, East Windham as they are having a waste water issue. Rebecca Winchell, DEC is working with their SPDES report; they have 20,000 gallons of waste to dispose of. The Girls Camp is not allowed to dump into the Town of Windham waste water nor is the town allowed to take. John Brust is also working on our pilot program with accepting private home septic into the WWTP.

<u>2.NEW APPLICATION for Sewer District Additional/New EDU's:</u> 425 County Route 12, Tax Map #95.01-2-3.2 is requesting for one EDU within the Town Sewer District for a residential single family home. A motion to approve was made by Councilman Van Valin, 2nd by Councilman Peters, with 4 in favor, one absent.

3.SEEKING PERMISSION to have a wedding at CD Lane Park with Tent: Kristen Hamilton is requesting permission to have an outside wedding and use the pavilion with a tent if needed should it rain for her wedding on July 26, 20204. There will be about 100 guests invited. A

The banner will be hung up from August 1 to August 19, 2024. The festival is for the weekend of August 14-18, 2024 located at 4752 State Route 23, Windham, New York. <u>9.AMBULANCE REPORT:</u> Ambulance Administrator Davia Montie was not present. Supervisor Hoyt gave the report. One of the ambulances was out of service due to an antifreeze issue. Matt Berger will soon be back to work as he has been out with some health issues.

<u>10.HIGHWAY REPORT:</u> Highway Superintendent Gary Thorington was not present. There was a tractor truck accident on State Route 23 on the Windham-Durham line. No one was injured. The tractor truck went down over the embankment. Highway Superintendent Gary Thorington was there helping to stabilize the state DOT road as the guardrails are missing. Safety is the issue for on-going travelers. Highway Superintendent Gary Thorington is in the process of hiring a new employee who will have a non-CDL license.

<u>11.POLICE REPORT:</u> Supervisor Hoyt gave the report. The new police office is coming along. The Police schedule is all set for the upcoming 4th of July event.

12.COMMITTEE REPORT: Councilman Walker attended the Coalition Meeting with Attorney Baker. Councilman Van Valin has a contractor to do the new flooring in the police office in the basement. The painting bid for the east side of the Centre Property has gone out and we are a waiting for the bids to come in. Supervisor Hoyt stated the Ladies in the Library are very happy with their new air conditioner unit. Councilman Peters received a note from KathodeRay Media our website host; as they have sold the company. The new owner will be keeping and working with the town on our website. Supervisor Hoyt stated there is a Sand Castle Contest at CD Lane Park on July 4, 2024. Saturday, June 29, 2024 from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm at 83 County Route 21, Windham; the town highway dept parking lot will be hosting a Greene County Hazard Waste Collection Day to the residence of Greene County. Please bring your driver's license for proof. Mid-Hudson Cablevision has been updating their fiber optics. They will be updating the lines to

the town hall. The Town of Greenport just finished updating their town government with Mid-Hudson Cablevision.

Various questions were asked from the interest in the bridge construction on County Route 40/56 for 2024. There will not be any bridge construction this year but Greene County is looking at 2026. Recently Supervisor Hoyt met with the Friends of the Windham Path Group for a tour of the Windham Path. As one of the group members said the "Tommy Tour". Other comments and concerns were made again about the two ball fields that are proposed to be at the Windham Path and the current Little League field. All comments were well received by the Board as they listened on to each person's comments.
